



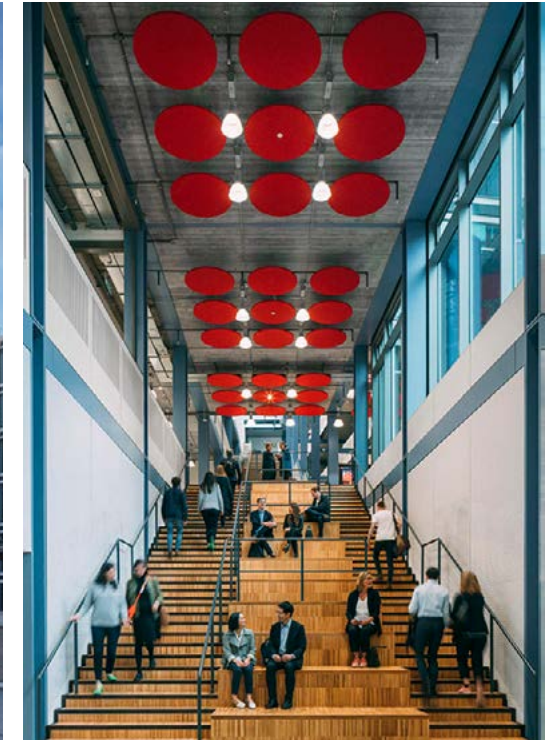
Centre Building

Set on Houghton Street at the heart of LSE's busy campus, the new Centre Building for Global Sciences is a 13 storey steel frame structure including two below ground plant levels. The project also included significant public realm works forming a new LSE square which significantly improves access and pedestrian traffic flow within the LSE campus.

The building contains five academic departments arranged over 10 floors above three floors of teaching space. This includes a dozen seminar rooms and four lecture theatres – a 200-seat basement auditorium, a newly formatted double-banked theatre seating 80 and two crescent-shaped 'Harvard-style' lecture theatres.

MSAFE were appointed as CDM Advisors to LSE and worked closely with Cantillon who led the demolition phase and were eventually appointed by Mace who took on both the Principal Contractor and Principal Designer roles at RIBA Stage 4 through to completion.
